

This policy applies to the transportation to home of students for reason of illness or behavior when parents do not have transportation.

The general policy is District employees will not use their private vehicles to transport children as part of their District responsibilities. If a child is ill or behaviorally out of control and going home is the better alternative for the child than remaining at school until the school day is over, the parent will be contacted and asked to come and get the child.

If contact is made with the parent, but the parent has no transportation and does not have family members or friends who can provide this transportation, the nurse or school personnel should discuss with the parent the options of the child remaining at school until the end of the day. If that is not a responsible option for the child due to the nature, extent or severity of the illness or behavior, the nurse or school personnel should contact the building principal. -A determination will be as to whether the child will be transported by the School Resource Officer (SRO) and the school administrator or designee. Only upon very rare conditions when illness or behavior is extremely severe will the SRO and school administration transport home. At the elementary level, preschool through fifth grade, an adult must be at home to receive the child or the child will not be transported home.

Under no circumstances will a nurse or other school personnel transport a child in a personal vehicle.
